Theme: Childlike Faith or Childish Faith?

Scripture: Mark 10:13-15 NKJ

"Whoever does not receive the Kingdom of God as a little child will by no means enter it."

#### A Thought:

We should never outgrow our childlike faith. We trust our Lord. He loves us. It is as simple as that...1 John 4:8 (NIV) "Whoever does not love does not know God, because God is love." To be sure, God's love does not want us to be foolhardy or dismiss intellectual thinking. Hence, the importance of his wonderful parables and his blatant exhortations. Simple but straightforward learning tools to exemplify our love for God. With this spiritual maturity we should be in the front lines defending Him. To do so we must read and study the word. A man with childish faith resists or is hesitant to learn the deeper meaning of the Word. Not unlike a child who does not learn from their parents. They eventually become defiant and lazy and spiritually fall away. In the book of Hebrews Paul takes a stand on the problem of immaturity. Hebrews 5:12-14 HCSB "For though by this time you ought to be teachers, you need someone to teach you again the basic principles of God's revelation. You need milk, not solid food. Now everyone who lives on milk is inexperienced with the message about righteousness, because he is an infant. But solid food is for the mature - for those whose senses have been trained to distinguish between good and evil." In his book Essential Truths of the Christian Faith, Theologian and author R.C. Sproul states "the New Testament does describe a certain childlike faith as a virtue." But he goes on to say that there is a tremendous difference between childlike faith and childish faith." That said, we must not be bullheaded in our spiritual growth.
